

FWPCOT3301 - Trim trees using a pole saw

This training course outlines the skills and knowledge required to safely operate and maintain pole saws. Pole saws are defined as powered professional standard pole-mounted chainsaws. These saws are generally telescopic and may be powered by fuel or batteries.

Candidates will learn how to:

Assist in the preparation of work site by

- + Identifying hazards and implementing controls
- + Completing pre-start pole saw checks
- + Developing effective communication skills
- + Assessing tree type, location, and stability
- + Reviewing direction of falling branches and limbs

Trim trees by

- Operating pole saws safely
- Selecting appropriate trimming and cutting techniques
- + Monitoring personnel movements and debris



- + Cleaning pole saws to remove dust, shavings, and debris
- + Inspecting pole saw for damage and working condition
- + Learning how to sharpen, adjust, or replace components as per manufacturer recommendations
- Completing written records and reports

To achieve competency the candidate is required to successfully complete a theory and practical assessment and demonstrating sufficient performance and knowledge evidence. Participants should have sufficient numeracy and literacy skills to read and comprehend instructions.
