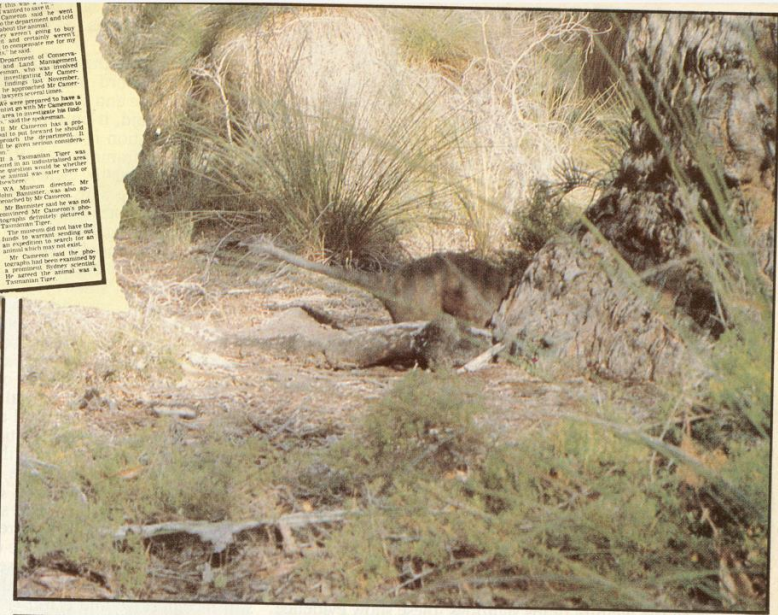
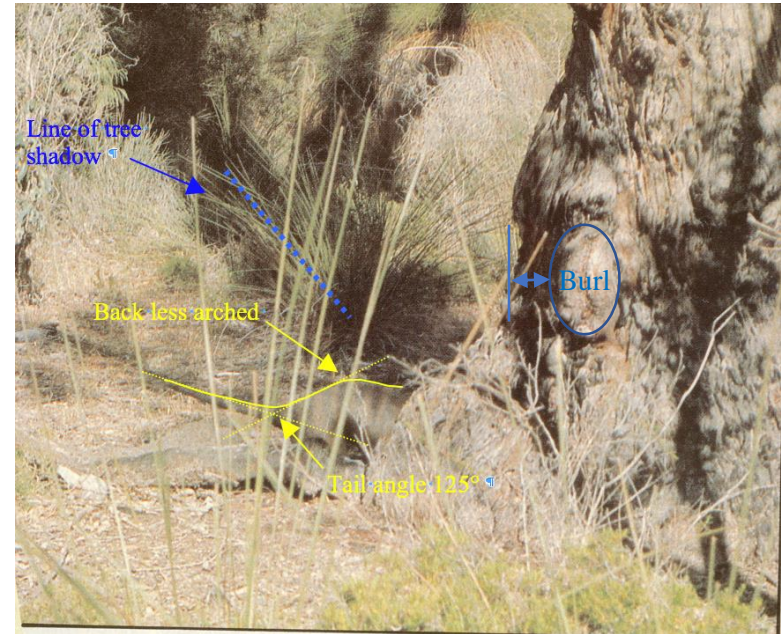
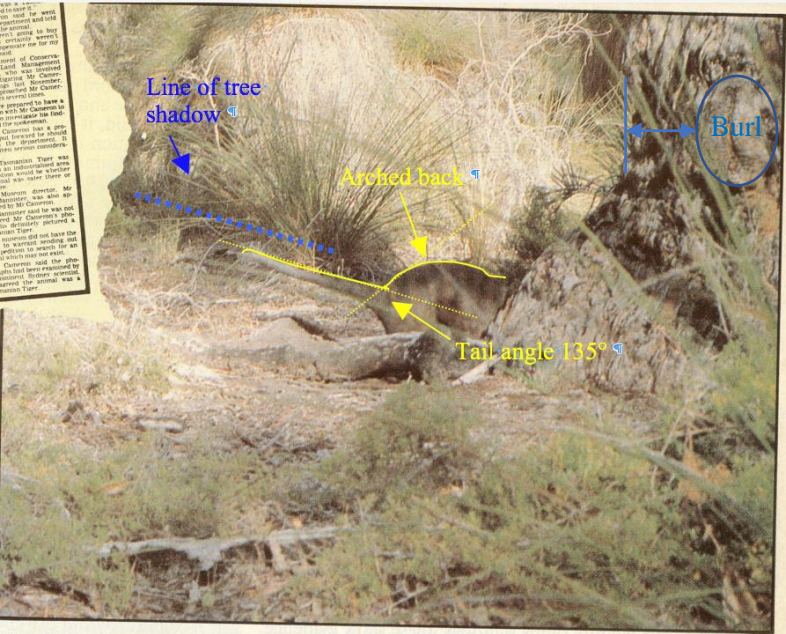


Kevin Cameron said animal was digging and photos were taken about same time. This is disputed due to change in shadow appearance suggested to imply several hours between photographs. This analysis is incorrect. The photographs were taken about the same time as the following analysis (next slide) demonstrates.

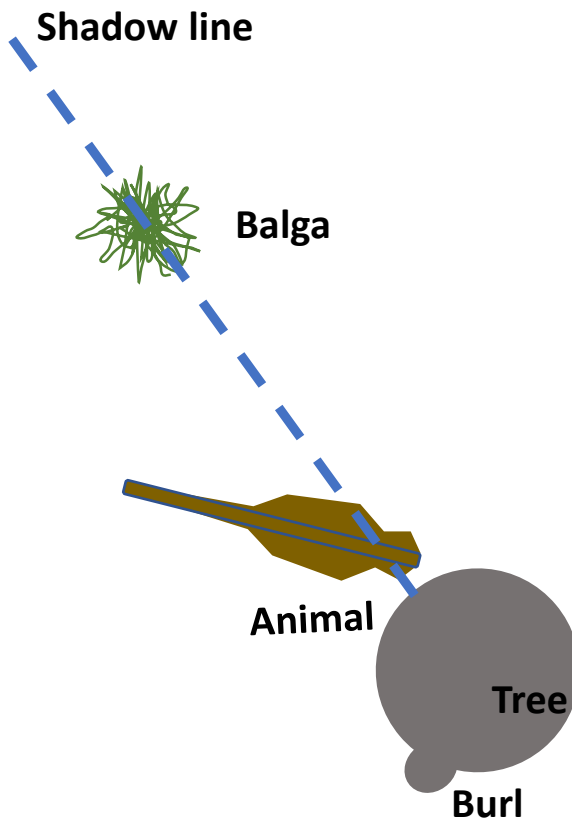


Shadow from large Marri tree crosses same Balga tree – this means photos taken about same time. Difference in shadow appearances are due to photographer moving to the right and taking second photo from slightly higher angle: Note Burl (circled) has moved closer to edge of Marri tree and is lower to ground.



Animal has moved – back less arched, tail flatter in second photo – with change of perspective tail should be slightly more acute and back slightly more arched if animal was immobile.
